2019 Cross Country Tournament

## Direct Athletics Process:

1. Each school must have a user name and password for Cross Country, Indoor Track, and Outdoor Track. You need to set this account up as soon as possible, and must be done by Fri., 10/25 at the latest for all Cross Country Teams. Schools have the option of setting up one account for all three seasons, or separate accounts for each season. Athletic Directors with input from their coaches should make this decision. If you already have a Direct Athletics account for your team/school, you do not need to create a new one.
2. Contact information: The coach must be listed as the contact. Each tournament director will have access to this information. Please do not list the school Athletic Assistant or Secretary, as this will delay the process when an issue arises or last minute information is needed. Information should include current e-mail and phone number(s), the number should be accessible beyond school hours, since most meets occur on weekends.
3. Rosters need to be updated as the season goes along, this will make the entry process go smoother at the deadline time.
4. Once your entries are completed you must print out a copy of your entries and check for accuracy. You will make updates and be able to edit changes up to the deadline. After the deadline there is still the MIAA late entry fee process that is listed in the MIAA Cross Country Format (\$30/athlete). Entry deadline is Monday, November 4, 2019 for Cross Country. After this date, any late entries must be done with the Tournament Director.
5. Cross Country - Each school only has to enter maximum of 10 names (you can enter less); you do not have to declare which 7 will run.

2. Each school may list ten (10) boys/girls, seven (7) of whom will be allowed to compete. The first five (5) boys/girls to finish will score for their schools. Five (5) boys/girls must leave starting box and finish for a team to score.
3. Divisional Placement - See MIAA Fall Tournament Alignments for 2017-18 through 2020-21.
4. Athletes should come dressed in proper school uniform, (school colors - jersey and shorts) ready to compete. The Uniform Rule will be strictly enforced. In case of inclement weather the Tournament Director MAY modify the Uniform Rule.
5. Entries: ALL ENTRIES WILL BE DONE VIA DIRECT ATHLETICS. Entries must be received by the Tournament Director by end of day on November 4, 2019. Any entries received after this date/time will be considered a late entry \& there will be a fee of $\$ 30.00$ per individual; $\$ 300.00$ per team/maximum, and must be entered with Tournament Director. FINAL DEADLINE: Absolutely no entries will be accepted after: 11/6/19 at Noon.
6. Numbers should be distributed only to the seven (7) actually competing. All numbers should be pinned securely on the front of the jersey. The tear-off tags should not be pinned. All will have a chip attached to number.
7. A plaque and certificates will be presented to each Team Champion and Team Runner-Up. Medals will be awarded to the first fifteen- (15) finishers in each race.
8. All teams must have adult representation in control of participants at all times. Such representation must be an employee or designated representative of the school district. If not the coach, representative must have written designation from the school principal.
9. The meet shall be run under the rules of the National Federation Track \& Field Rule Book except as modified by the MIAA.
10. Finality of Decisions - The referee's decision in all matters shall be final and without appeal except in those meets for which a Jury of Appeals has been established for that special purpose. The Jury of Appeals ( 3 officials and 2 coaches) then will have the final authority. In order to have an appeal processed a coach must submit the appeal in writing to the referee within thirty (30) minutes after the results are announced.
11. Medical Coverage - A licensed athletic trainer, physician, physician's assistant, certified EMT, or nurse practitioner will be available at all MIAA Divisional and State Cross Country Meets. The MIAA will compensate for this coverage at these sites.
12. Awards Ceremonies -In the East the awards ceremonies will begin at approximately $11: 30$ am for D3, 2 \& 1 and 2:55 pm for D6, 5 \& 4. In Central, West and at the All-State, will be done at conclusion of final race.
13. All State Meet -Teams qualifying will be posted on MIAA website. If listed you are in, no further information will be sent.
14. Ties in team scoring shall be resolved by comparing the sixth-place finishers from the tying teams. The team with the best sixth-place finisher shall prevail. If one team does not have a sixth-place finisher, the team with the sixthplace finisher shall prevail.
15. MIAA Drone Policy - Prohibiting the Use of Drones (Unmanned Aircraft Systems or UAS’s) The use of drones (UAS), for any purpose, is not permitted at any MIAA tournament event. This prohibition applies to all fields of play, courts, arena, mats, gym floor or pool, and covers a ban on the entire facility being used as part of the MIAA event, including the spectator stands and parking areas.
16. CHIPS ARE IN THE BIBS - STUDENT-ATHLETE MUST CROSS FINISH LINE. REMIND THEM NOT TO STOP AND CHECK THEIR WATCH. COULD AFFECT THEIR TIME.
17. Officials will be assigned by the Tournament Directors.

Wildcards - \#1 Wildcard Team will be the fastest $5^{\text {th }}$ place team from Division 1, 2 or 3 and then \#2 Wildcard Team will be the next fastest from among the remaining two $5^{\text {th }}$ place teams and the $6^{\text {th }}$ place team finishing immediately behind the \#1 Wildcard. Fastest: cumulative time of the top 5 finishers from a team.

## Eastern MA: Boys and Girls (Div. II - Small Schools)

Top four (4) teams from Division 4, 5 \& 6 sectional
Top seven (7) individuals from Division 4, $5 \& 6$ not on one of the qualifying teams
Wildcards - \#1 Wildcard Team will be the fastest $5^{\text {th }}$ place team from Division 4, 5 or 6 and then \#2 Wildcard Team will be the next fastest from among the remaining two $5^{\text {th }}$ place teams and the $6^{\text {th }}$ place team finishing immediately behind the \#1 Wildcard. Fastest: cumulative time of the top 5 finishers from a team.

## Central \& Western MA: Boys and Girls

Top three (3) teams from Div. I sectional and top ten (10) individuals not on those teams qualify for the Division I (Large School) State Championship Title.

Top three (3) teams from Division II sectional and top ten (10) individuals not on those teams qualify for the Division II (Small School) State Championship Title.
